#### **Contact** - Jargon

Progressive teachers find emailing parents is a great way to communicate. This is an opportunity to establish this if not already in place.

Education jargon is common in schools and can be a cause of miscommunication - never hesitate to ask for clarification. Schools often produce a glossary of terms which can also assist.

### Would you like to be active in the classroom or school?

Most teachers welcome help in their classrooms, show your interest and offer times you are available to help.

Perhaps work commitments don't allow this, there may be other ways to be involved in the school. Sometimes schools live stream events so that working parents can be included

#### Focus On your child

Stay focussed on your child and their learning needs. What other students are doing is irrelevant. Time will be very limited, so be mindful of why you are there. It's also a great opportunity for your child's teacher to find out more about your child from you. This can support greater connection



## **Be Prepared**

#### What is it you want to know and ask?

Ensure you have thought about what you want to ask. Prioritise questions, if you are unable to get through them, ask if you could email them to the teacher at a later date.




### **Discussion Points**
